Instead of blasting the rock off the site, the builders decided to make it useful. They designed around it (and with it) and have fashioned a comfortable sofa on top of it. Sitting there looking out one of the many arched windows, one is treated to a sweeping view of Green Valley, Rancho Bernardo and the mountains beyond.

The sofa-rock is on the balcony of the dining area looking down into the living room. The master bedroom, on the same level with the dining area, also looks down on the living room through an arched open area which is partially screened with carved balusters.

On one wall of the master bedroom, the bricks were indented in an arched form to make a natural headboard for the bed. Off the bedroom is the master bath, containing another of the unusual features in the house: a free-form bath

tub, made with round-shaped mosaic tiles - each one carefully put in place by hand. Over the tub is a beautiful arched window area containing colored glass. Two huge closets with mirrored doors, a shower and lavatory complete this inviting bathroom.

The kitchen is furnished with stainless steel appliances, including a built-in wall oven. A long hallway with arched windows looking out on the front courtyard, leads the way to the two other bedrooms and second bath.

All the rooms are fully carpeted including the kitchen and baths, and each room has a commanding view of the outdoors.
